CONFESSION OF SIN—led by Bob

Officiant Dearly beloved, we have come together in the presence almighty God our heavenly Father, to set forth his praise, to hear his holy Word, and to ask, for ourselves and on behalf

Pause for moment of silence

Officiant and People together, all kneeling

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

The Officiant alone stands and says Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. Amen.

INVITATORY & PSALTER Led by Bob All stand

Officiant Lord, open our lips.

People And our mouth shall proclaim your praise.

Jubilate Psalm 100 *Led by Officiant Kathy*

Kathie: Let us praise the Lord, using the words of Psalm 100 on page 2 of your bulletin Saying together,

Be joyful in the Lord all you lands; * serve the Lord with gladness and come before his presence with a song.

Now let us join together in saying Palm 85,

See how close his salvation is to those who fear him? Our country is home base for Glory! 10-13 Love and Truth meet in the street, Right Living and Whole Living embrace and kiss! Right Living strides out before him, and clears a path for his passage.

FIRST READING Romans 1: 6-10 Reader: Officiant Kathie

Moses said, "The word that saves is right here, as near as the tongue in your mouth, as close as the heart in your chest."

It's the word of faith that welcomes God to go to work and set things right for us. This is the core of our preaching. Say the welcoming word to God—"Jesus is my Master"—embracing, body and soul, God's work of doing in us what he did in raising Jesus from the dead. That's it. You're not "doing" anything; you're simply calling out to God, trusting him to do it for you. That's salvation. With your whole being you embrace God setting things right, and then you say it, right out loud: "God has set everything right between him and me!"

SECOND READING & KID STORY Matthew 14:24

Narrator: Bob Jesus: Don Peter: Fr. John Disciples: Everyone

Narrator: Meanwhile, the boat with the disciples was far out to sea when the wind came up against them and they were battered by the waves. At about four o'clock in the morning, Jesus came toward them walking on the water. They were scared out of their wits. Crying out in terror, they shouted,

Narrator: Jesus was quick to comfort them, saying,

Jesus: "Courage, it's me. Don't be afraid."

Narrator: Peter, suddenly bold, said,

Peter: "Master, if it's really you, call me to come to you on the water."

Narrator: Jesus said,

Jesus: "Come ahead."

Narrator: Jumping out of the boat, Peter walked on the water to Jesus. But when he looked down at the waves churning beneath his feet, he lost his nerve and started to sink. He cried,

Peter: "Master, save me!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!!""

Narrator: Jesus didn't hesitate. He reached down and grabbed his hand. Then he said,

Jesus: "Faint-heart, what got into you?"
